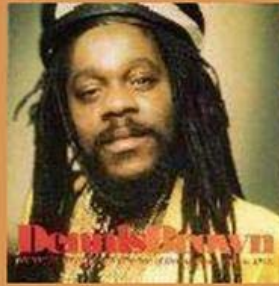


Dennis Brown Tribute

The Crown Prince of Reggae

50 years in the making and the Crown Prince of Reggae still lives on. Born February 1, 1957, this year marks 50 years that the world has known a compassionate spirit, a strong voice, and a dedicated teacher. Dennis Emmanuel Brown is one of the great legends of Reggae music, recording his first song in 1969 when he was only 12 years old. We can say that this was the beginning of a thirty-year musical career, yet that would be an understatement. He was a child prodigy who first sang in concert with Byron Lee & the Dragonaires band at age 8. As one of the pioneers of Reggae music, D. Brown has been an inspiration to many artists and was Bob Marley's favorite singer. His vocal style defined Reggae music. Without his vocal style, reggae vocals as we know them today would not exist. Dennis Brown became the most influential singer in Reggae. He was well known for his abilities as a vocalist. It was the content of his music that really brought him admirers all over the world.

Brown recorded and released up to 175 albums including countless duets and single tracks. He sang positive lyrics, spreading messages of love and unity. Brown was Rastafarian, which is an Ethiopian-centered religion and being deeply spiritual, his music reflected a way of life that praised the Most High and uplifted the black community. Tracks like *Love and Hate*, *Revolution*, and *Have you Ever* are great examples of the positive images D. Brown offered to the public. He didn't only sing about these topics he also went into the community as a teacher, spreading the word. This was his passion: teaching the youth. He set up legacy which the DEB Memorial Organization Inc. in New York has continued by giving academic scholarships yearly. The DEB foundation in Jamaica has raised money for medical and dental screenings for schools in Jamaica.

His 50th Anniversary Tribute is way to continue his work and legacy. On the official tribute website www.dbtribute.org there are items for sale and proceeds will go to the high school he attended in Kingston, Jamaica. This will help the school gain access to soccer uniform and equipment for a soccer program, music room with instruments and DJ system and a computer room with a copier, printer and laptops. Having these resources at the school will help promote D. Brown's vision of giving youth positive skills. He saw athletic, computer and musical skills as a alternative to crime in the Caribbean and provided opportunities to better lifestyle. 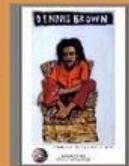
